ST. JOSEPH: Last year, Pope Francis proclaimed a s special year of St. Joseph beginning on the Feast of the Immaculate Conception 2020 and extending to the same feast 2021. Next Wednesday the feast of the Immaculate Conception 2021 marks the close of that year.

The year marked the one hundred and fiftieth anniversary of the declaration of St. Joseph as the Patron of the universal Church, a declaration made by Blessed Pope Pius 1X in 1870.

In his Letter to coincide with the occasion Pope Francis explained that the aim of this dedicated year was to increase our love for this special saint, to encourage us to implore his help, to imitate his virtues and his zeal. He described St. Joseph as a 'beloved father, tender and loving, an obedient father, an accepting father, a father who is constantly courageous, a working father, a father in the shadows'

FEASTDAYS FOR THE WEEK

Monday 6th. December. *St. Nicholas.* Bishop of Myra in modern day Turkey who lived in the fourth century and very little is known about him. Patron of Russia, pawn-brokers and children.

Tuesday 7th. December. *St. Ambrose.* 340-397. Ambrose studied law at Rome and later became governor of the province where Milan was the administrative centre. He was acclaimed bishop by the laity even though he was not yet baptised. He accepted baptism and was ordained a priest in 374 and later the bishop of Milan. A gifted preacher and writer and defender of the faith. Patron of Milan.

Wednesday 8th. December. The Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary.

Thursday 9th. December. *St. Juan Diego.* 1474-1548. In 1531 Our Lady appeared to Juan Diego and told him to ask the bishop to have a church built on that spot. Eventually the church was built and dedicated to Our Lady of Guadalupe. After the church was built Juan Diego devoted himself to the care of the sanctuary and the reception of pilgrims until his death in 1531.

Friday 10th. December. *Our Lady of Loreto.* Pilgrims go to Loreto in Italy to pray at the house where Mary was born and visited by the angel Gabriel and where the Holy family lived. According to tradition the small house was carried by angels from Nazareth to Loreto on the night of the 9-10 December 1294. [The Liturgical Calendar]

Saturday 11th. December. St. Damasus, Pope. 304-384. Elected Pope in 366 he was active in combating the heresies of his day. He commissioned St. Jerome to translate the Bible into Latin.
