FEASTDAYS FOR THE WEEK

Monday 13th. December. St. Lucy. Martyred in the fourth century in Sicily. She is listed among the martyrs mentioned in the first Eucharistic prayer.

Tuesday 14th. December. St. John of the Cross. 1542-1591. John spent his early years in religious life as a Carmelite friar. In 1568, St Teresa of Avila persuaded him to work for the reform of the Carmelite order and in this he met much opposition, sever punishments and imprisonment. In spite of all John continued with the reforms. He was a man of deep prayer, an accomplished poet and a spiritual writer with a mystical touch. He was canonised in 1726 and declared a doctor of the church in 1926.

A GIFT FOR BABY JESUS: On the occasion of a person's birthday, family and friends give gifts to the one celebrating and we acknowledge that as a normal acceptable, good practice, but what if, instead of giving the gifts to the person celebrating, we gave the gifts to one another and didn't give anything to the birthday person. Would that not seem a little odd!

Christmas day is the birthday of Baby Jesus and for the most part what we do is give presents to one another and forget about the birthday child, Jesus. But, you might say, it is not that we are ignoring Jesus, but what present could I give and how would I get it to him. The shepherds and the wise men came to the stable and the living Jesus, the new born child, was there but it is not the same for us but we can still give, and what can we give! A little time, a promise, a word of thanks.

This year, a Christmas stocking for Baby Jesus will be placed at the crib in each church and children and adults may place little notes of thanks to Jesus, for gifts and blessings received, maybe a word of promise that you will come and visit Jesus at the crib and say a prayer there, maybe a prayer for others who may be sad this Christmas or a word that you will make every effort to be the best you can be. Think of what you could give and, please God, this little exercise may help us to appreciate the true focus of Christmas. God among us as a little child.
