FEASTDAYS FOR THE COMING WEEK:

Friday 29th. April. *St Catherine.* 1347-80, remembered as a mystic and reformer of religious life. Proclaimed a Doctor of the Church in 1970 and Patron of Europe in 2000.

Saturday 30th. April *St. Pius V.* 1504-72. Elected Pope in 1565. He implemented the reforms of the Council of Trent including the Breviary, Missal and Catechism.

PILGRIMAGE: The Achonry diocesan Pilgrimage to Knock takes place on Sunday 15th. May. Anointing of the Sick, 2.30pm. Concelebrated Mass 3pm followed by Rosary Procession. We will be joined, for this pilgrimage, with the diocese of Clonfert and Galway

THE ROSARY: The Rosary is recited twice daily, Monday to Saturday, 9.30 am and 2 pm and at 6 pm each Sunday in Charlestown Church. All are welcome to join in praying the Rosary.

DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY: Divine Mercy Sunday was formally established as a feast of the universal church by Pope John Paul 11 in the year 2000. It is to be celebrated on the Second Sunday after Easter. The Pope's decision to establish the feast on this particular Sunday is in response to the words of the Lord Jesus revealed to Sr. Faustina and found in her diary, 'It is my desire that the Feast of Mercy be solemnly celebrated on the First Sunday after Easter'. [Diary of Sr. Faustina parg. 699]

This is not a new feast that conflicts with Easter, but the renewal of an ancient feast of the Church, that celebrates Christ rising from the dead and thereby bringing everlasting life to mankind, which is Divine Mercy. The feast of Mercy emerges from the very depths of the tenderness of the Lord.

Our Lord Jesus says to Sr. Faustina 'Tell the whole world about my inconceivable mercy. I desire that the Feast of Mercy be a refuge and a shelter for all souls, and especially for poor sinners. On that day the very depths of My tender mercy are open. I pour out a whole ocean of graces upon those souls who approach the fount of My Mercy'. [Diary of Sr. Faustina parg. 699]

At the 10.30 am Mass in Bushfield and the 12 noon Mass in Charlestown the image of the Divine Mercy will be blessed and people will have an opportunity to venerate the image then and for the remainder of the day both churches.
