FEASTDAY FOR THE COMING WEEK:

Friday 13th. June St. Anthony of Padua. Born in Portugal around 1195. He was named Fernando at this baptism. He began his studies with the Augustinians at the age of fifteen and after his theology studies he was ordained a priest. Some time later he sought and received permission to join the Franciscans and as a Franciscan he received the name Anthony. He went to Morocco but shortly after his arrival there he became seriously ill and had to be sent home. On the sea journey home they encountered a severe storm and high winds blew their ship to land in Sicily.

Anthony was taken into the care of Franciscans and they nursed him back to health. From there he was sent to Northern Italy and found his way to Padua where he became famous as a gifted preacher. It was in Padua in 1231 that he preached his last and most famous Lenten sermons. People came in large numbers to hear Anthony preach and also to go to confession. Anthony would spend hours on end hearing confessions. Whatever spare time he had, he spent in prayer and of course fasting was part of everyday. The selfless effort he gave to his work left him exhausted and he died at the very young age of thirty six. Anthony is the patron saint of the lost and found.
