FEASTDAYS FOR THE WEEK

Tuesday 28th. June. St. Iraneus. Iraneus was born in Smyrna, Asia Minor, now Izmir in modern Turkey in the year 130, He emigrated to Lyons in France where he later became bishop. He pioneered the work of selected the books that ought to be included in the Bible. The definitive list was to be ratified at a Church Council several decades later. Iraneus became bishop of Lyons where his approach was to win people to Christ by love rather than fear. He died in the year 202.

Wednesday 29th. June. Sts. Peter and Paul. We celebrate the twin founder of the Church of Rome on q day traditionally considered its foundation day by Romulus. Both Peter and Paul were martyred, Peter by crucifixion in 64 and Paul by beheading three years later.

Friday 1st. July. St. Oliver Plunkett. Oliver was born in Co. Meath in 1625. He went to Rome to study for the priesthood and was ordained there in 1654. He taught in Rome for many years and in 1669 he was appointed archbishop of Armagh. He worked tirelessly in that ministry until his arrest in 1679. He was taken to London for trial where he was found guilty of high treason for 'promoting the Catholic faith' and sentenced to death. He was hanged at Tyburn on the 1st July1681. He was canonised in 1975.
